Pick-up Points:

Obverse markers

- Obverse clashes:
 - The hallmark UDU, which, due to die abrasion work, can appear very faint and/or difficult to see, until the coin is properly oriented to light
 - Grade B talon-head clash
- Die scratches:
 - Four distinct parallel die scratches above the W in WE
 - Two distinct die scratches between the 9 and 7
- 1971S SB DDO Family 2b (a weaker example of this family), with tripling seen in the "N", "T", and "GOD" in the motto (a stronger example of family 2a would have distinct tripling at the bottom of the D and the upper left of the second T in TRUST).

Reverse markers

- Clash repair: "XV" die scratches to the right of the earth, jaw line remnant
- Die scratches in the Caribbean, northwest South America, and the Pacific off of South America
- "Tic-Tac-Toe" die scratches inside the "D" on DOLLAR
- 1971S SB DDR Family 3. Best seen in AR in DOLLAR.
